


## Local and Regional Flaps in Head & Neck Reconstruction: A Practical Approach

he advances in reconstructive surgery in recent decades are mainly due to the expansion of the use of free microvascular flaps. However, local and regional flaps still play as important role in the restoration of postoperative head and neck defect as free flaps. The book offers an overview of various local and regional flaps, relevant anatomy, harvesting techniques, the pros and cons. It also addresses surgical complications and methods of the prophylaxis.

The author provides original techniques for plastic reconstruction of defects in the skin and soft tissues of the head and neck, oral cavity, oral pharynx, and laryngeal pharynx. The techniques descriptions are accompanied by excellent case studies.
